"You still didn't come to a complete stop," says the deputy. "License and registration, please."

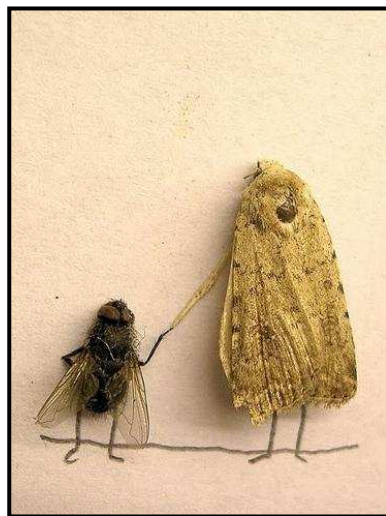
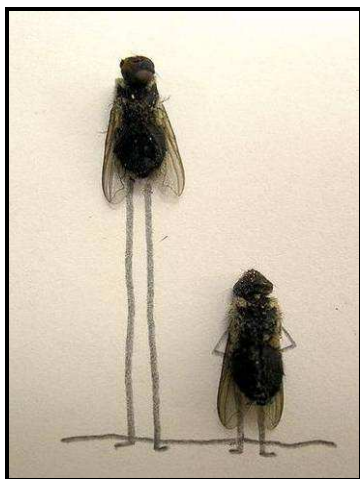
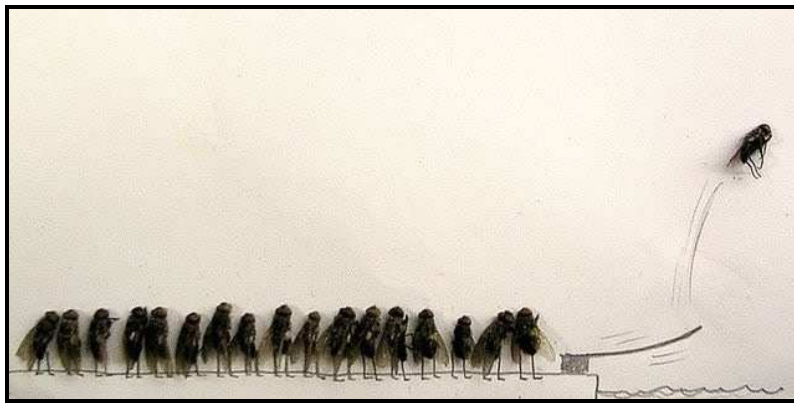
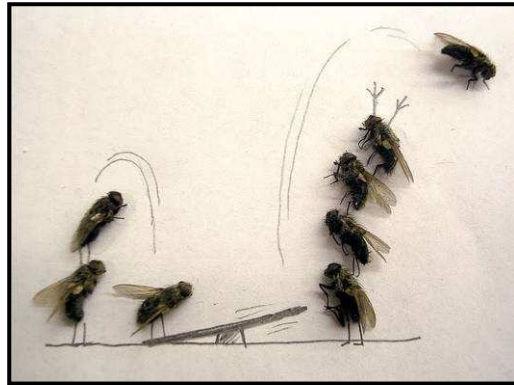
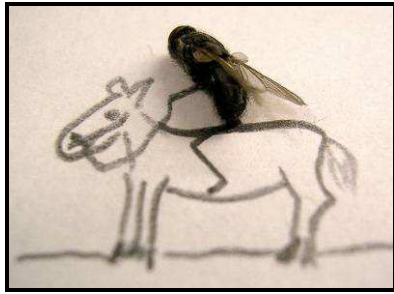
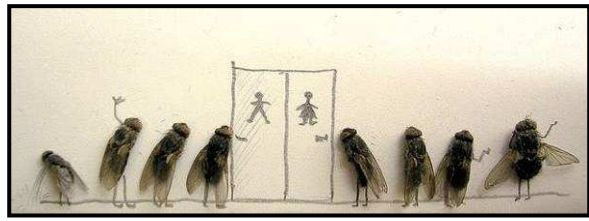
The lawyer says, "What's the difference?"
